Imran Jattala Sahib - Age group 4-7:

- Ablution
 - Getting prepared for prayers
 - Makes the prayer valid

- Hadith: “There is no prayer if there is no Wudhu or any of its alternatives”
- Step-by-step instructions (Salat – The Muslim Prayer Book<http://www.alislam.org/books/salat/index.html>):
 - Wash *hands* three times (first right then left)
 - Rinse *mouth* three times
 - Clean *nostrils*, by pushing up some water and let it out, three times
 - Take water in your hands and wash *face* from forehead down to chin, below the chin and from ear to ear three times
 - Wash *arms* put water in your hand and raise hand so that the water falls down your arm and move the water with the other arm and wash up to your elbow three times
 - Masah: rinse hand and run hands down your *head* (don't let your thumbs or fingers touch your head) until the back of the head, clean *inside your ears* with your index fingers and *behind the ears* with your thumbs
 - Wash *feet* until the ankles three times
- Prayers
 - Recite Kalima Shahdah:
Ashhadu alla aila ha illallahu wahdah ula asharee kalahu wa ashhad uanna Muhammadan 'abduhu warasooluh
 - *Allahumaj'alneeminattawwaabeenawaj'alneemin almutatahiree n.* – O Allah make among those who repent me repent of my sins and make among those who keep themselves who keep themselves pure and clean
 - **Homework: memorize prayers after Wudhu**
- Hadith
 - *Khairuzaditta qwa* : The best thing you can take with you is righteousness.
 - Hadith
 - Hadith books

- Authentic sayings of the Holy Prophet^{SAW} that have been preserved
 - Homework: memorize this Hadith
- Reading Surah Al-Fatiha and first ruku of Surah Al-Baqarah (age 5)
 - Starting to read the Holy Quran
 - Memorize Surah Al-Fatiha (already have done so because of Salat)
- Salat
 - 5 daily prayers
 - **Fajr** – morning/dawn prayer, slightly before sunrise (1 hour and 23 minutes)
 - **Zuhr** – immediately after zenith (when the sun is right over your head)
 - **Asr** – late afternoon prayer
 - **Maghrib**– immediately after sunset
 - **Isha**– late evening prayer, offer thanks to Allah for the day
- Prayer
 - (5 years) for parents: *Rabbirhamhumaakamaarabbayaanisagheera*
 - [Khazeenat-do'a](http://www.alislam.org) on www.alislam.org
 - Homework: for 5 year old, memorize this prayer
- History
 - The Holy Prophet^{SAW} – Muhammad also Ahmad
 - Parents' names of the Holy Prophet^{SAW}
 - For parents: review early childhood of the Holy Prophet^{SAW}
 - Name of KhulafaRashideen (5 years)
 - Hadhrat Abu BakrSiddeeq^{RA}
 - First Khalifa selected by the people who gathered after the Holy Prophet^{SAW}'s demise at MasjidNabawwi
 - Father of HadhratAisha^{RA} (wife of the Holy Prophet^{SAW})

- HadhratUmarFarooq^{RA}
 - Second Khalifa
- HadhratUsmanGhani^{RA}
 - Third Khalifa
- HadhratAli^{RA}
 - Fourth Khalifa
- [For parents: read stories of the Khulafa](#)
- Yassarnal Quran
 - Review how certain words pronounced
- Personal notes

Homework: learn parents' full names and grandparents' full names

Dr. Chairul Bhari (Age 7-10)

- Age 7-8
 - Boys should accompany their fathers to the mosque for prayers
 - “A believer without masjid is like a fish without water”
 - Quran
 - Complete reading first 10 parts of Holy Quran
 - Should read the Holy Quran *everyday*
 - Should have your own Quran
 - 2nd part of the Holy Quran
 - Pay attention to lengths of the letters in the Quran
 - 2:143-145
 - madds
 - Prayer
 - After Wudhu: after you complete the “washing”

- Recite Kalima Shahdah:
Ashhadu allaailaaha illallahuwahdahulaashareekalahuwa ashhaduanna Muhammadan 'abduhuwarasooluh
- *Allahumaj'alneeminattawwaabeenawaj'alneeminalmuta tahireen.* – O Allah make among those who repent me repent of my sins and make among those who keep themselves who keep themselves pure and clean
 - Homework: memorize prayer after Wudhu
- Hadith
 - To tell the authenticity of the Hadith: should not contradict the Holy Quran
 - *Sibaabulmuslimifusooq* – Abuse by a Muslim is an evil; Abuse of an Muslim is an evil;
 - As a Muslim, we should not abuse anyone because we are Muslim
 - As a Muslim, we should not be abused *by* anyone and we should pray for them
 - Homework: memorize this Hadith
- Homework: memorize first verse of *Quran sab se acha*
- Homework: poster of an attribute of Allah – *Rabbul 'aalameen*
- Age 8-9
 - Quran
 - 11:8
 - *Sittatiyyaam* – 6 days
 - *'arsh* – throne, Allah's majesty
 - Salat
 - Niyyat – before you raise your hands, before *Allahuakbar*
 - *Wajjahtuwajhiyalillatheefataras-samaawaatiwalardhahaneefanwamaaana mina-lmushrikeen*
 - I have turned my full attention towards Him, Who has created the heavens and the earth being ever inclined to

Him, and I am not one of those who associate partners with Allah.

- Hadith
 - *Khairukum man ta'allamalQuranawa 'allah*
 - The best among you is the one who learns the Quran and teaches it

Lutful Mannan Sahib (Age 10-14)

fulManaan Sahib (10-13)

- Age 13-14

- Ramadan – should fast for at least 15 days
- Review Quran, prayers, and Ahadith from previous age groups
- Hadith
 - *Afshu-ssalaamubainakum* – promote saying greetings of peace to each other
 - Make a habit of saying *Assalamualaikum* when meeting other Muslims and entering the mosque and entering the house
 - The Promised Messiah^{AS} – when other nations invented other greetings, they lost respect with each other and segregation formed
 - **Homework: memorize the above hadith**
 - *Inna aulannaasibillahimam-bada'akumbissalaam* – The best among the people in the sight of Allah are those who are the first to say salaam (peace)
 - Trying to be the first to say salaam is gaining nearness to Allah
- Quran
 - **Homework: study first quarter of Surah Al-Baqarah with translation**
 - Helps you understand the meaning of the Quran

- Homework: *Wopeshwahamaara* Hadhrat Masih Ma'ood^{AS}
- 10 couplets
- History
 - Holy Prophet^{SAW}'s history until Hijra
 - Why should we study this?
 - The importance of his life in Mecca
 - After he received his first revelation taken from Life of Muhammad^{SAW}

Saed Saud Sahib (Age 15+)

- Quran (4:25-33) – Age 14-15
 - ﷻ Allah is addressing you
 - Believing slave girls: taken under the protection of the Muslim men after the war
 - Consult their family and pay the haqmehr
 - Haqmehr: dowries
 - *Yureedullah*– Allah wishes
 - *Yahdeekum* – guides you
 - Allah wants you to deviate from your passions; a warning
 - *Yastab'eena* – those who follow the passions
 - *A-shahwaat* – bad passions
 - Words that usually start with ت is referring to “you” second person conjugation
 - Allah doesn't want to burden you He wants to lighten (*yukhaffafu*)
 - A lighter responsibility

- *Laatakulu* – do not eat, *laa* – definitely not, *la* – definitely
- *Amwaalukum*– your wealth
- *Bainakum*– between yourselves
- *'udwaanan*– transgression
- *zulman* – injustice
- *nukaffar* – we remove
- Whenever see ﷻ is referring to “We” as in Allah
- *Tamattau* – do not wish
- *Rijaal* – men
- *Nisaa* – women
- *Naseeb* – earnings
- 7:89-95 Age 15
 - Imposing a religion on a nation is not something new, we see it today in Indonesia and Malaysia, but also during the time of King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella in Spain
 - *Udnaa*- return
 - Words ending in ﷻ is referring to our
 - *Faatiheen* – those Who decide
 - *Taba'tum* – you follow
 - *Jaathimeen* – became victims; suffered from death
 - *Rajfatu*– earthquake
 - *Nasahtulakum*– and advised to you
 - *Bilba-saai* – with adversity
 - *Wa-ldarraai* – and hardship
- 12:54-57 Age 16
 - *ubarrii* – I absorb
 - *'utoonibihi* – bring him
 - *aj'alnee* – appoint me

- *birahmatinaa* – Our mercy
- *laanudee'* – We will not let go
